

YU Undergraduates Enrolling in Individual YU Graduate Courses:

Graduate credits earned at YU by matriculated YU undergraduates may be applied to their undergraduate degree requirements or to their undergraduate major requirements by approval of the major department chair. Undergraduates taking graduate courses also require permission of the graduate program director.

If the student matriculates into a graduate program at Azrieli, Katz, Revel, the Fish Center, or Syms within three years of taking YU graduate credits, those credits may be applied to the graduate degree per program requirements in effect at the time the student enters the graduate degree and at the discretion and approval of the graduate program director. The number of graduate credits that can be applied to the graduate degree will be limited to the number allowed for students pursuing a dual degree in that graduate program (typically 9-12 credits depending on program).*

Earning graduate credits as an undergraduate is not a guarantee of future admission into any graduate program at YU.

*This policy does not apply to licensure or health science programs.
