Mazel tov to all of our Class of 2020 graduates!

This week's parsha, B'haalotcha, opens with Hashem instructing Aharon (through Moshe) to light the candles of the menorah. However, instead of using the usual word for "light" (l'hadlik), the Torah uses "b'haalotcha," which literally means to lift up. Rashi explains that there was a stair in front of the menorah, and Aharon climbed that stair to lift himself up to accomplish his mission. The Torah immediately tells us, "Va'yaas kein" (he did so): Aharon stepped up and carried out his important task of bringing light to the mishkan.

Over the last four years, YU has helped you develop the "stair" that will be your foundation for the rest of your life. In your Torah studies, your Mada studies, and the way in which you have learned to bring both together, you have developed the skills, the mindset, and the values needed to succeed in every endeavor. Please make sure to use that stair as Aharon did, to reach your potential, accomplish your mission, and bring light to a world sorely in need of it! We look forward to celebrating with you again when we can declare about you, "Va'yaas kein."
