## POLICY ON CREDIT FOR THE ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATION

Students who have taken the Advance Placement Examination in high school may qualify for college credit.

- 1. A score of 1, 2, or 3 does not earn credit or exemption.
- 2. A score of 4 or 5 earns credit for the equivalent course. In Computer Science A and Physics, a score of 5 is required to earn credit.

- (2) Students may not take a foreign language AP examination in their native language.
- (3) Not toward major, minor or Interpreting Literature and the Arts of General Education Requirements.
- (4) Students who want to take more advanced Computer Science courses must pass a Python 3 exam (at the 80% level) administered by the Computer Science department. Upon doing so, the 4 credits for COMP ELEC will be changed to 4 credits for COMP 1300C.
- (5) Student requires IDS 1400: Regression Analysis
- (6) A score of 5 is required to count toward Statistics for Business requirement.
- (7) Elective or as Music Elective toward Music major or minor.
- (8) Credits granted for MATH 1412 with AB subscore of 4 or 5.

## THE JERUSALEM EXAMINATION

Credit is awarded depending upon the score earned.

A combined score on Parts I and II of 150 earns 3 credits of a Hebrew elective.

A combined score on Parts I and II of 160 or above earns 6 credits of Hebrew electives.

Regardless of the credits earned, the number of Hebrew courses to be taken at SCW is determined by the SCW Hebrew Placement Exam.
