

ANNE SCHEIBER SCHOLARSHIP FUND

ABOUT THE FUND

Benefactor Anne Scheiber believed in the mission of YU: to apply the best of Torah values and Western knowledge to serving the community. In 1995, the Anne Scheiber Scholarship Fund was established from her estate for financially and academically deserving women "who have indicated their desire to assist in the development of humanity, and alleviate pain and suffering."

Scholarships for up to full tuition may be awarded to graduates of Stern College for Women (SCW) who are attending Albert Einstein College of Medicine (Einstein) and who are determined to require financial assistance. Scholarships are awarded and reviewed annually by the university for SCW graduates who have been accepted by Einstein and demonstrate financial need. The requirements of this scholarship can change at any time without notice, and no reliance should be placed on the availability of this scholarship.

HOW TO APPLY

As soon as you have been accepted to Einstein, or in advance, you may begin the scholarship application process by filing a new FAFSA at https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa

To be eligible for the Scheiber Scholarship, the student must include parental income and asset information on the 2022-23 FAFSA. The student must also include the **Yeshiva University's School Code: 002903** in the school section of the FAFSA in addition to the Title IV School Code of Einstein (allows for up to 10 schools).

Once the materials have been submitted, evaluated, and received by Yeshiva University, send a cover letter addressed to Dean Karen Bacon describing your interest in entering the helping profession of medicine and requesting scholarship consideration. *Please include your name, address, and YU ID in the heading.*
