Okay, history lesson over – let's jump into what we're really here for: the swag, the eookies, the erazy erisis, the shtick, the delicious dinners, this year's topics! Our committee sessions this year will focus on two critical issues that threaten international peace and security.

First, disarmament of terrorist groups. Operating across borders and outside established international agreements, these groups make it difficult for

Second, biosecurity and biowarfare. Biotechnology has the potential to revolutionize medicine and improve lives, but it also carries serious risks if misused. Events like the COVID-19 pandemic have shown the importance of global preparedness and the catastrophic potential of biological crises. Our discussions will focus on strategies to strengthen biosecurity while supporting responsible scientific innovation.

As you dive into your research and preparations, please remember that you are representing the official stance of your assigned country, not your personal views. Take the time to really understand your country's position, build strong, well-supported arguments, and come ready for a thoughtful and respectful debate. I want the discussions to be highly intellectual and respectful, but nevertheless intense and bold.

Before you submit your papers, please keep the following three ideas in mind: (1) As you research and write your position papers, please make sure to provide citations. (2) AI must not be used under any circumstances when writing your papers. Doing so would constitute a grave violation of the sacred trust bestowed upon you as an esteemed delegate of the great committee of DISEC, and would result in the disqualification from winning an award (and earning my fellow chairs and my friendship which is arguably more valuable). (3) Extra points will not be awarded for occasional humor... but that doesn't mean I won't secretly love it.

I am excited to see the perspectives you bring to these important discussions. Your preparation, creativity, and diplomacy will make our sessions both meaningful and engaging.
