

ONLINE HOUSING APPLICATION PROCESS
Frequently Asked Questions, Spring 2020 Application
Wilf Campus, Yeshiva University

When and how can I apply for Housing?

The application will be open in December for new students. The application is fully online and accessible via your YU student credentials, which you will receive once you have confirmed your attendance.

Is Housing required on the Wilf campus?

Students must reside in University Housing their first two semesters on campus. In rare cases, this requirement is waived, sometimes for students above 21 years old, married, or commuting from home, although other cases are considered. Contact the Housing Office to apply for a requirement waiver.

Are emergency contacts necessary?

Three individuals you would feel comfortable with us contacting in an emergency are required. All your emergency contacts should be over the age of 18 years old, and at least one should live in the NY area.

Is there a housing deposit?

A \$300 housing deposit is required to process your Housing Application. This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable and can be paid online with a credit card. You may contact the Office of Student Accounts (Furst Hall 121; 212-960-5269) with any issues.

What should I include in the comment section on the housing preference page?

This is your opportunity to add any pertinent details. If you have a request for special accommodations due to a medical condition, disability, or other circumstance, provide a detailed description. Documentation is required before special accommodation requests can be considered and must be submitted by the deadline.

Am I guaranteed housing?

This application does not automatically guarantee a room assignment. The Office of University Housing & Residence Life reserves the right to grant housing privileges. Every effort will be made to grant your housing request, but requests cannot be guaranteed.

What is the Meal Plan?

The meal plan is mandatory for undergraduate students residing in University Housing. New students choose between 2 different meal plans on their housing applications. For additional information, go to <http://yu.edu/dining/dining-club>

What are my room options?

Morgenstern Hall, 2-person Room: There is an entire floor of Morgenstern Hall devoted to new Spring students. Every room is air-conditioned, and within the building are the Morgenstern Beit Midrash, the Sephardic Beit Midrash, a game room, a laundry room, and a main lounge. Each floor features communal bathrooms and a lounge.

Morgenstern Hall, Single Occupancy: Residents may have a double-occupancy without a roommate. Nothing is changed in the room; all furniture remains. Apart from an approved medical request, this is the only way to guarantee a room to yourself.

Muss Hall, 2-person Room: Muss Hall is home to upperclassmen and rabbinical students and has limited availability for new students and features double-occupancy rooms, communal bathrooms, and a large communal lounge on the second floor. Muss Hall rooms are not air-conditioned and the building does not have elevator access.
