Open Rank Faculty Positions Available

The Sandra Rosenbaum School of Social Work at the University of Wisconsin-Madison invites applications for tenure track or tenured positions at the assistant, associate or full rank beginning August 2022. Duties include establishing (for Assistant rank) or continuing (for Associate/Full) an excellent, forward-looking research program, strong teaching and mentoring at the undergraduate and graduate level, and service to the School of Social Work, the university, and the profession. The normal teaching load in the School of Social Work is four courses per year at the undergraduate and/or graduate level (two courses per semester). Successful candidates will have a Ph.D. in Social Work or a related field. Assistant candidates will have their Ph.D. by the start of the appointment and provide evidence of the potential to achieve excellence in scholarly research and teaching. Appointment at the tenured level requires evidence of excellence in scholarly research. Strong value is placed on an established record of responsive, effective teaching and service. For a tenured position, candidates should have at least 6 years in a university faculty position or government or social work research position and a demonstrated track record of national leadership in their area with academic accomplishments as a scholar and teacher that meet the standards for a tenured appointment in the School of Social Work. Social work practice experience is preferred but not required.

We welcome candidates of all specializations relevant to social work. An ability to teach in all program levels (i.e., undergraduate, master's, doctoral) is required. The successful candidate's research, teaching, and service clearly implement anti-oppressive practice and policy. The successful candidate will work to proactively support the expansion of diversity among all components of the School, and ensure an inclusive, fair, and equitable environment that fosters engagement.

The School of Social Work strives to enhance human well-being and promote human rights, social and economic justice through five academic programs, in partnership with hundreds of community agencies, and based on almost a century of experience. The faculty of the School of Social Work are committed to rigorous research aimed at advancing knowledge about social work, social welfare, and intervention strategies. The faculty is highly interdisciplinary, working in fields such as human development, psychology, public affairs, economics, urban planning, sociology, and social work and have a long history of excellence in research, in teaching, and as practicing social workers. Many faculty are affiliated with research centers on campus that foster a dynamic intellectual environment and invite collaboration such as the Institute for Research on Poverty (IRP), The Center for Demography and Ecology (CDE), The Waisman Center, the UW Center for Health Disparities Research (CHDR) and the Center for Financial Security (CFS) to name a few research hubs. The department provides an excellent environment for the development of an outstanding research program and a vibrant place to learn and teach.
