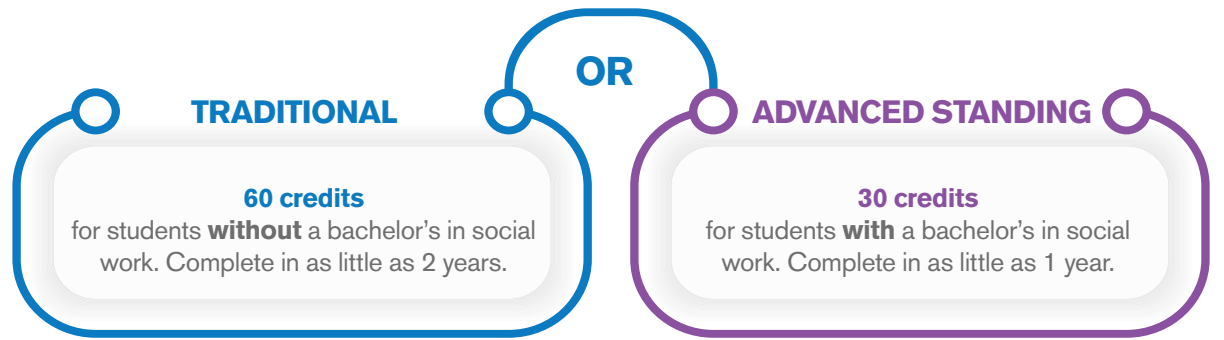
MSW Options at a Glance

CHOOSE A PLATFORM

ON-CAMPUS

Classes meet in **NYC at our Wilf Campus** in Washington Heights.

LIVE VIRTUAL CLASSROOM

Synchronous learning via real-time platform face-to-screen with other students and faculty.

ONLINE

Asynchronous learning on your own time at your own pace.

CHOOSE COHORT/ENTRY TERM

SUMMER BLOCK 1: JUNE - JULY

8 weeks in NYC. Field work in your hometown during the fall/spring with additional online coursework.

4 weeks in NYC and continued online work through August. Field work in your hometown during the fall/spring with additional online coursework.

SUMMER BLOCK 2: JULY - AUGUST

TRADITIONAL MSW: FALL OR SPRING START

Follows traditional academic semesters. Choose On-Campus, Live Virtual Classroom, or Online.

Dual program to earn your MSW that leads to becoming a Credentialed Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counselor (CASAC).

JOINT MSW/CASAC: FALL, SPRING OR SUMMER START

CHOOSE ADVANCED PRACTICE METHODS

CLINICAL

Advanced skills for one-on-one work with individuals and families.

GROUP WORK

Advanced skills for practice in group settings.

COMMUNITY PRACTICE

Advanced skills for advocacy, policy and leadership within communities and organizations.

For students passionate about understanding people with addictive disorders and helping them work through the challenge of healing and recovering. Earn both your MSW (leading to the LCSW). Type of Placements: Addiction clinics, rehabilitation centers, mental health centers, hospitals, psychiatry practices, etc.	For students passionate about enhancing life for the elderly or those with life-threatening illnesses. Additional scholarship may be available. Type of Placements: Hospice, hospital, long-term care facility, community agency primarily focusing on the service needs and/or clinical issues of individuals (of any age) and families facing serious illness.	For students who are interested in child-protection services, child abuse prevention, adoption and foster care services. Type of Placements: Administration for Children Services, foster care agencies, adoption services, correctional facilities, etc.	For students who would like to focus on working in educational settings. Type of Placements: Schools and school-based programs.	Geared towards students who would like to incorporate the arts in direct clinical practice. Type of Placements: Schools, hospitals, mental health clinics, substance abuse treatment facilities, care homes, rehabilitation, hospice work, etc.	For students interested in direct clinical practice with clients who have been impacted by various types of trauma. Type of Placements: Military services, mental health clinics, substance abuse treatment facilities, rehabilitation, hospitals, schools, etc.	Designed for students who would like to work with military personnel, military families, and veterans. Type of Placements: Military bases, Veterans Administration (VA) services, VA hospitals, mental health clinics, substance abuse treatment facilities, rehabilitation, care homes, etc.
