[^0]II. Major Requirements - See Fact Sheets and department websites.

Only one course in the major may count toward the general education requirements, with the exception of a science major in which the first year sequence counts toward the Science and Technology category. Exceptions may also apply toward the Quantitative Skills requirement.
III. Jewish Studies

All students are required to complete six (6) semesters of CORE and fourteen (14) additional Jewish Studies credits except as indicated in paragraph III C below. The courses should be chosen to meet the distribution requirements in Paragraph B below.

## A. CORE segment

1. CORE is a unit of three courses that total eight (8) or nine (9) credits. CORE is required during the first six (6) semesters of attendance at SCW.
2. The student determines the CORE credit value (3, 4, 5 or 6 ) at the time of registration. Each semester the CORE average grade is recorded for the credit value selected.

60\% of the major and minor must be completed at SCW in NY.
Up to 12 credits of approved courses at AGS and BRGS may apply toward the SCW residency requirement.
