### Messianism in Jewish Antiquity: Syllabus

#### *Course Overview*

This course will provide a close and near-comprehensive study of messianic ideas within Jewish tradition from the time of the Bible up until the age of the expulsion from Spain. We will begin with an examination of introductory themes – the difference between messianic belief and consciousness, the types of messianic beliefs, and the triggers for acute expectation – and then turn out attention to a chronological exploration of Jewish tradition. Starting with the Hebrew Bible, we will work our way through the Second Temple period into the Rabbinic era – attending to the disparate genres – and then end with the medieval streams of thought – pietist, rationalist, and mystical.

For this course there are no materials that you will be required to purchase—all readings will be made available on canvas or are available online and will be linked or indicated on the canvas page.
