MASTER OF ARTS IN JEWISH STUDIES

At the Master of Arts level, we provide students with broad and intensive training in their fields of study. The M.A. degree is offered in the following areas of concentration: Bible, medieval Jewish history, modern Jewish history, Jewish philosophy, and Talmudic studies. The program is structured to appeal to men and women (40 percent of our current student body is female) who strive to enhance their Jewish learning through a rigorous and stimulating program. Whether you want to continue professionally in fields such as law or business, enter into more traditional areas like Jewish education or Jewish communal service, or pursue the degree out of intellectual curiosity and personal interest, the program is for those who want to be challenged and inspired.

PH.D. IN JEWISH STUDIES

The Ph.D. program requires forty-two course credits beyond the Master of Arts degree of that twelve credits of doctoral planning and research. Twenty four of these must be taken at the school or by prior arrangement with the school. It follows that up to six credits may be transferred toward the Ph.D. degree from other institutions. These must be doctoral-level courses taught in accredited graduate programs. In addition to the forty-two credits, a student may be required by the faculty of a given concentration to master particular skills or areas of knowledge deemed necessary for the doctoral research.

M.S./M.A. AZRIELI-REVEL DUAL DEGREE PROGRAM

The Azrieli-Revel Dual Degree (ARDD) program, through which students earn an M.S. at [Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education and Administration](#) and an M.A. at Revel concurrently (with some courses counting toward both degrees), is designed to provide aspiring Jewish educators with high-level professional preparation in both methods and content, by combining the discipline of pedagogy in Jewish graduate education at Azrieli with the acquisition of a level of expertise in academic Jewish studies at Revel.

The Azrieli-Revel Dual Degree (ARDD) M.S./M.A. program provides aspiring Jewish educators with high-level training in both methods and content, by combining the traditional program of graduate study in Jewish education at [Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education and Administration](#) with the acquisition of a level of expertise in academic Jewish studies at Revel.

B.A./M.A. IN JEWISH STUDIES

The B.A./M.A. program allows undergraduates to take up to four courses with Revel that can be counted both towards their undergraduate and graduate degrees. To be admitted to the program, students must have senior standing (94 credits). Revel courses do not fulfill the YC Jewish Studies general education requirements but may be taken as electives.
