



POLICY ON CREDIT FOR THE ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATION

Students who have taken the Advance Placement Examination in high school may qualify for college credit.

1. A score of 1, 2, or 3 does not earn credit or exemption.
2. A score of 4 or 5 earns credit for the equivalent course. In Computer Science A and Physics, a score of 5 is required to earn credit.

- (4) Students who want to take more advanced Computer Science courses must pass a Python 3 exam (at the 80% level) administered by the Computer Science department. Upon doing so, the 4 credits for COMP ELEC will be changed to 4 credits for COMP 1300C.
- (5) Student requires IDS 1400: Regression Analysis
- (6) A score of 5 is required to count toward Statistics for Business requirement.

THE JERUSALEM EXAMINATION

Credit is awarded depending upon the score earned.

A combined score on Parts I and II of 150 earns 3 credits of a Hebrew elective.

A combined score on Parts I and II of 160 or above earns 6 credits of Hebrew electives.

Regardless of the credits earned, the number of Hebrew courses to be taken at SCW is determined by the SCW Hebrew Placement Exam.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS
 Sixty percent of the major and minor, and at least 84 credits and 6 semesters must be completed at the Syms School of Business. Transfer student residency requirements depend on the number of semesters completed in another institution; however, a minimum of 60 credits and 4 semesters must be completed on campus.
