What is a Secondary Application?

A secondary application or “secondary” is a questionnaire sent directly from the school (usually via email) to the applicant after their online AMCAS or AADSAS application has been received. Please note that most of these require additional fees. They also tend to have very quick turn-around deadlines, so as with everything, DON’T WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE TO WORK ON IT.

Schools ask many additional questions in secondaries take your answers very seriously. Common questions include:

- ✓ Why do you want to attend XX medical school?
- ✓ Why do you want to go to medical school in YY city?
- ✓ What do you think after reading our mission statement?
- ✓ Why would you would be a good “fit” for ZZ medical school?
- ✓ Have you ever received any moving violations or speeding tickets?
- ✓ Have you ever been subject to disciplinary action at school or work, etc.?

Others may ask for one or two page essays on such topics as what you think is the greatest challenge in health care today, or to describe a challenging event in your life, how you dealt with it, and which mentors you sought advice from on how you handled it.

These take time and thought to answer. These answers are scrutinized as they reflect the questions individual medical schools want most answered by applicants.

Try to describe experiences **not** covered in your personal statement to show that you will bring depth and breadth of experience to the class and the profession.

If you are asked to name your referees, state the Pre-health Committee of Yeshiva University.

Timing Of Secondaries

Most schools expect you to return within 7-10 days after receiving it, so be prepared to complete them quickly. Many are listed on the school’s website so you can review the questions in advance. Just be sure to double-check before sending in your answers to make sure the school did not change the questions from last year to this year.
