

## **TEMPORARY VISITOR ACCESS POLICY (3/12/2020)**

The health and safety of our community is our top priority, and we continue to monitor the Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation in close consultation with the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH) and other governmental agencies.

We have decided to restrict access to our campuses for visitors, including alumni, spouses, vendors and contractors (i.e., individuals who are not currently-enrolled students, faculty, and staff with valid Yeshiva University ID Cards), as follows:

- The Guest Policy for all University housing is suspended. Accordingly, only individuals residing in University housing are permitted there.
- Only visitors with scheduled appointments with University faculty and staff for legitimate University business (such as job interviews) will be permitted to enter academic buildings. Approved visitors will be required to present a valid government-issued photo ID. Faculty and staff are requested to exercise discretion in hosting visitors at this time.
- Alumni, as well as spouses of alumni and spouses of current students, will **ONLY** be permitted access to:
  - The Glueck Beit Midrash located in the Glueck Center for Jewish Study
  - The Fischel Beit Midrash located in Zysman Hall
  - The Shenk Shul located in Schottenstein

(Other Minyanim on our campuses are restricted to current students.)

- Visitors who have recently been in an affected country (even if just a stop-over) should delay their visits to the University until they have been in the United States for 14 days and are not presenting any symptoms. The faculty or staff host is responsible for ensuring compliance.
- Any visitor who is coughing or shows other signs of illness will be respectfully asked to leave.
- The Library Visitor Policy remains in effect.

The University reserves the right to further restrict access to our campuses for visitors, as well as students, faculty and staff, without advance notice.
