Sexual Assault (part 1) Rape - The penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim. Fondling - The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental incapacity.

Sexual Assault (part 2)

Incest - Sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.

 ${\it Statutory\,Rape}$ - ${\it Sexual}$ intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.

Domestic Violence - Clery Act

- A felony or misdemeanor crime of violence committed by
 - a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim
 - by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common
- by a person who is cohabitating with, or has cohabitated with the victim, as a spouse or intimate partner
- by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction in which the crime of violence occurred OR
- by any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction in which the crime of violence occurred

Dating Violence

The term "dating violence" means violence committed by a person -

- (A) who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim; and
- - (i) The length of the relationship.
 - (ii) The type of relationship.
 - (iii) The frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship.

Stalking (Title IX): 34 U.S.C. 12291(a)(30)

The term "<u>stalking</u>" means engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to -

- (A) fear for his or her safety or the safety of others; or
- (B) suffer substantial emotional distress.

Additional Clery Act Definitions

- (ii) For the purposes of this definition -
 - (A) Course of conduct means two or more acts, including, but not limited to, acts in which the stalker directly, indirectly, or through third parties, by any action, method, device, or means, follows, monitors, observes, surveils, threatens, or communicates to or about a person, or interferes with a person's property.
 - (B) $\it Reasonable\ person$ means a reasonable person under similar circumstances and with similar identities to the victim.
 - **(C)** Substantial emotional distress means significant mental suffering or anguish that may, but does not necessarily, require medical or other professional treatment or counseling.
