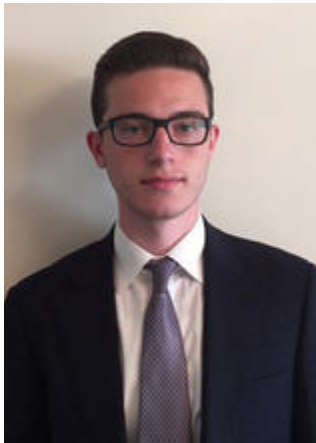
2017-2018 PRE-HEALTH PEER MENTORS

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

62 American MD medical schools accepted applications from international students in 2014. Unfortunately more than half of those schools only accepted applications from Canadian students.

If an international student wishes to be accepted at an MD school in the US , there are three things that are absolutely necessary:

- have a financial backer who can guarantee four years of tuition—this amounts to somewhere in the neighborhood of \$200-300K.
- international students must be straight "A" students, at least in their science and math classes and all of their work should be done on campus.
- international students must have MCAT scores, in each of the four sections, that puts them in the 93rd or above percentile.

If a student is able to satisfy these three conditions, the international applicant then has a decent chance of being accepted to a school in the US.

International students should also consider the Israeli schools for their training.
