

### Jewish Studies Requirements

Bible, Judaic Studies, Jewish History, Jewish Philosophy, Hebrew Language

Students are required to complete 22 courses of Jewish Studies\*, with a minimum of 2 courses taken each semester

\*Exceptions may apply for students pursuing certain joint programs, and those transferring in from Katz or another university

A student who has completed one year of study in Israel **may** receive credit for up to 10 courses; to complete the remaining 12 courses, she will take 2 courses during each of her semesters on campus

### Jewish Studies Requirements

Distribution of Requirements – must be completed on campus at SCW

Bible – 2 course minimum

Judaic Studies – 2 course minimum

Jewish History – 1 course minimum

Jewish Philosophy – 1 course minimum

Hebrew Language - dependent on placement:
