

### 7. 128 credits

Students may not graduate without taking a minimum of 128 credits.

This may require additional courses beyond those needed to satisfy all other requirements.

## Jewish Studies Requirements

Bible, Judaic Studies, Jewish History, Jewish Philosophy, Hebrew Language

Students are required to complete a minimum of 18 courses totaling at least 36 credits\*, with a minimum of 2 courses taken each semester

\*Exceptions may apply for students pursuing certain joint programs, and those transferring in from Katz or another university

A student who has completed one year of study in Israel **may** receive credit for up to 6 courses/12 JS credits; to complete the remaining 12 courses, she will take 2 courses during each of her semesters on campus

Students who come directly from high school will take three Jewish Studies courses their first year (Hebrew + 2 other Jewish Studies courses)

## Jewish Studies Requirements

Distribution of Requirements – must be completed on campus at SCW

## One course minimum in each subject area:

- Bible
- Judaic Studies
- Jewish History
- Jewish Philosophy

#### Hebrew Language - dependent on placement:

- HEBR 1001 and HEBR 1002 and {BBLE 1405 OR 1410}
- 2. HEBR 1010 and HEBR 1020
- 3. HEBR 1030
- HEBR 1211 or HEBR 1221 depending on placement, or HEBR 1240 [equivalent to either]
- Exempt pending writing sample
   Other exemptions: Bagrut certificate; Jerusalem Exam score of 85 or above
