

## YU Campus Climate Survey Report

Fall 2025

Pursuant to New York State law, Yeshiva University (YU) conducts periodic campus climate assessments to evaluate students' general awareness and knowledge of the University's prevention and response to sexual assault. The Campus Climate Survey was developed by the Yeshiva University Campus Climate Survey Committee for this purpose.

The survey was administered to all enrolled YU undergraduate, graduate, and professional school students during the Fall 2025 semester. Participation was voluntary, and responses were collected anonymously and confidentially. The survey achieved an overall response rate of 11.1%. The results of the survey are presented below.
