We will begin with a באר הגולה dealing with questions about *Torah she'b'al Peh* and will include general survey of traditional *aggada* interpretation. Next major topic is נתיבות עולם section on prayer. Rest of term is open to suggestion. Our focus will be on textual analysis of Maharal and his approach to aggada. For overview of my approach, see Carmy, "Learning from Maharal: A Non-Mystical Approach with Illustrations from *Gevurot Hashem* and Other Works" (in *Books of the People*, ed. S. Halpern).

Several short written assignments during the term, mostly devoted to preparatory analysis and exploratory comparison. The culminating paper (8-10 pages) should be on some aspect of Maharal or to other treatments of the topics addressed in the course.

First written assignment: will examine Maharal on mishnayot in Avot—details on the way with comparison to other commentators: Major authors on Avot include Rashi, Rambam, R. Yonah (printed with Talmud); Bartenura, Tosafot Yom Tov (=student of Maharal); Tiferet Yisrael (early 19<sup>th</sup> century) [printed in standard Mishnayot]; R. Bahye (14<sup>th</sup> century Spain); Midrash Shmuel (16<sup>th</sup> century anthology). For Maharal's דרך חיים מהר"ל (— ויקיטקסט see דרך החיים (wikisource.org) with links to Hartman edition at the end of the article.

Primary works: Maharal's writings are available online. גור אריה (=Rashi on Humash) was first to be published; אגדה (in two versions) the last. גבורות ה' (=Pesah) is part of trilogy also including (Shavuot) and נתיבות עולם (Exile and redemption=Tisha B'Av). נצח ישראל on "ethics, prayer, Torah study et al). Volumes on Hanukka and Purim (נר מצווה hand מור חדש) are not in the "standard" editions. Recent editions are rich in footnotes, especially Y. Hartman's.
