By Professor Adam Teller, Brown University



Adam Teller is Associate Professor of Judaic Studies and History at Brown University and the 2012/13 Senior NEH Fellow at the Center for Jewish History in New York. Born in London and educated at Oxford University, he received his doctorate from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He works on the economic, social and cultural history of early modern Jews in Poland-Lithuania. He has published two monographs, both in Hebrew: *Living Together: The Jewish Quarter of Poznan in the Seventeenth Century* (Jerusalem, 2003) and *Money, Power, and Influence: The Jews on the Radziwill Estates in Eighteenth Century Lithuania* (Jerusalem, 2005). His articles cover a wide range of topics, including the history of the Polish-Lithuanian Rabbinate and the fate of the Jews during and after Gezeires Tah-Tat.
